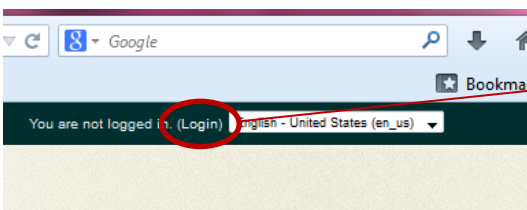

Welcome to the Pennsylvania Data Quality Curriculum (DQC). Before getting started with your chosen track, please take some time to go through this brief Introduction to Moodle and the DQC. This introduction is to assist you in effectively navigating the tracks and tools within Moodle.

The Modular Object Oriented Dynamic Learning Environment, or Moodle, is an online learning management system (LMS), designed to create opportunities for rich instruction between instructors and learners. Moodle allows users to store, communicate, and collaborate through a variety of resources from forums and messaging to uploading files, adding links, and more.

What will you need?

- The provided login and password, examples below (logins may vary)
 - User Name: first name.last name (ex. john.doe)
 - Password: xxxxxxx (after the first initial login you will be prompted to change your password)

Resource Information

- The resource information will be found throughout the DQC Moodle site. These resources are to be used while taking your chosen track and include documents as well as links to sources such as the Pennsylvania Department of Education (PDE) website, EdNA, NCES, webinars, and the PIMS manual and collection calendar.

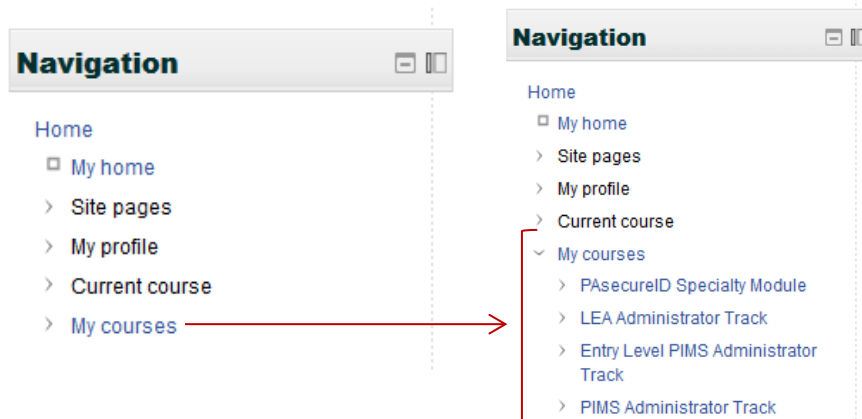


Navigation

- Navigation options include links to the Home page, as well as My Home, Site pages, My Profile, and My Courses.
 - The Home page link will bring you back to the main page of the DQC Moodle site.
 - My Home gives an overview of the tracks you have been enrolled in, links to access the tracks, and allows for uploading and access to your private files.
 - My Profile allows for you to view your profile, participate and review in forum posts and discussions, add and view blog entries, access to messages, upload and

retrieve your private files, track notes, tags which allow for information to be easily found, and the calendar for track events.

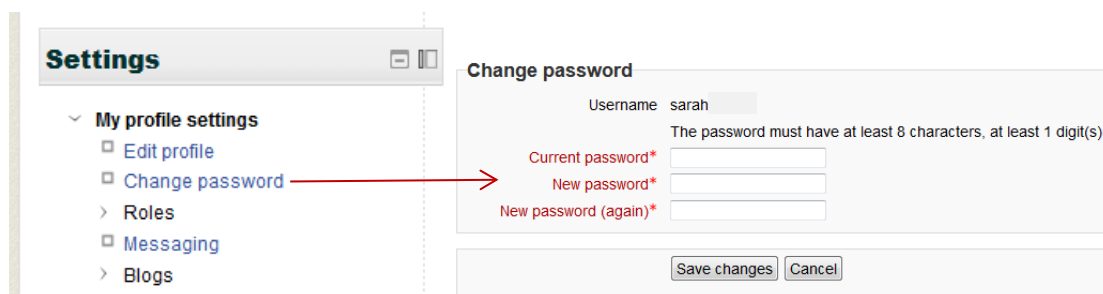
- Site pages allow the user to view other participants in their enrolled course, site blogs, notes, tags, and the calendar.
- My Courses, when dropped down, allows for quick access to your enrolled tracks.



Settings

My Profile Settings will allow you to edit your profile, change your password, and access grades. Once a quiz or assignment had been completed, grades will be assigned upon the close of the exercise. You may view your grades for each individual quiz or assignment or for the entire course you are enrolled in.

- Upon logging in for the first time you will be asked to change your password. From the Home page on the left hand side of your screen under Settings click on the drop down arrow (\vee) next to My Profile Settings. Once expanded select Change Password and you will be redirected to a new page. Enter the new password information in the correct fields and click on Save Changes.



- To view grades select a course within which you are currently enrolled. On the left hand side of your screen under Settings click on the drop down arrow (\vee) next to Course Administration. Once expanded select Grades. You will be able to view individual scores for each quiz under User Reports and under Overview Reports you will be able to view the total grade for each course in which you are enrolled. (*Grades are reflected according to what has been completed.*)

Assignments are located within the corresponding exercise and track. The assignment submission page will show the assignment deadline and further details. To submit an assignment you may use one of the following options:

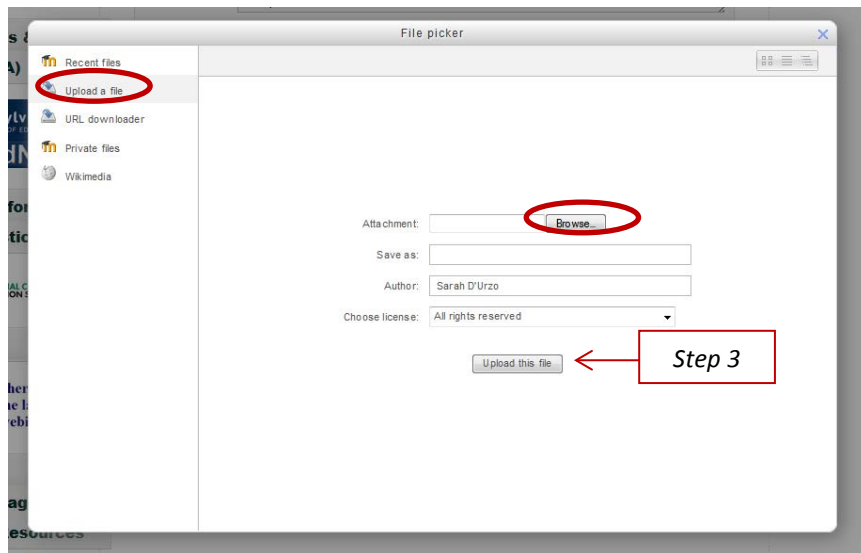
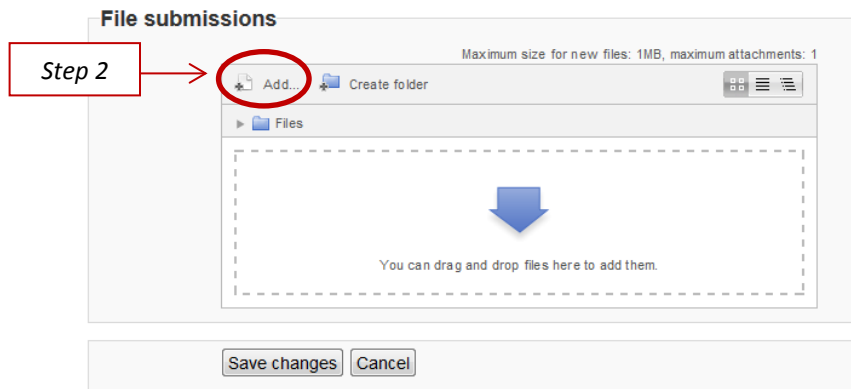
- For file submissions, click *Add submission*, then click on *Add...* to browse for the file to upload. Finally, click *Save changes* to confirm.

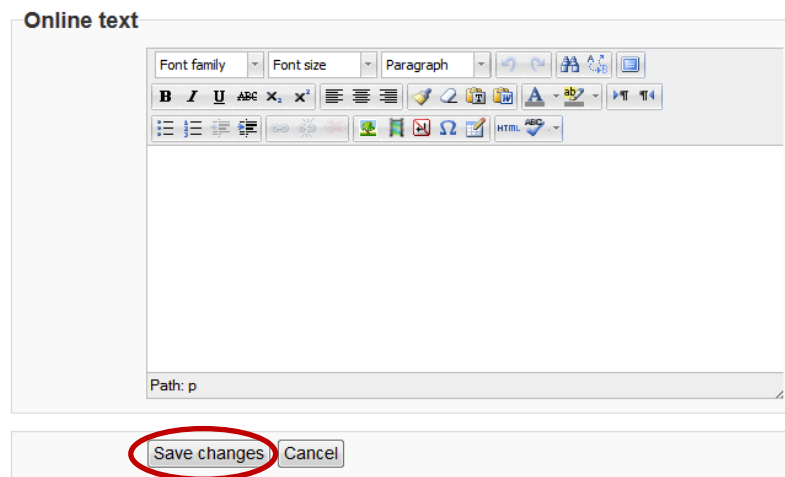
